The Company recently held a budget-making process sensitization workshop for the Nairobi County Assembly Sectoral Committee on Water and Sanitation.

The top management took the Committee members through the processes and procedures undertaken as the budget cycle kicks off.

The Ag. County Executive Committee Member for Environment, Energy, Water and Natural Resources Mohamed Amed Dagame and Chairman for Water & Sanitation Committee of the Nairobi City County Hon. Paul Kados gave their remarks.

"Water is a social and economic good. It is also a basic constitutional right as enshrined in Article 43(d) of the constitution of Kenya 2010. The demand for water has increased in response to increased population and economic activities." Dagame said.

"It is our mandate as elected leaders to oversee and support implementation of policies and programs aimed at improving service delivery, as well as discuss means in which the problems faced in the sector can be eradicated." Said the Chairman.

The Sectoral Committee on Water and Sanitation is established under the provisions of standing order 203 and under the Third Schedule is mandated to consider all matters related to "Water and Sanitation Services including Water Distribution, Management, Regulations, Marketing and Sewerage Services"
