NCWSC TAKES WASCO GAMES BY STORM TO BECOME OVERALL WINNER

The Company emerged overall winner in the just concluded 12th edition of the Water Sports Companies Organization (WASCO) hosted by Narok Water and Sewerage Company Ltd (NARWASSCO).

NCWSC clinched position one in the following disciplines: squash, netball, volleyball ladies, scrabble, draught, athletics, badminton, pool and ajua while it came second in volleyball men, traditional dance and chase. Over 30 water companies registered and participated in the competitions.

This year's theme was: "Combating Climate Change Crisis through Sports". The clarion call aligns to the efforts undertaken by the Ministry of Water, Sanitation and Irrigation, agencies, Water Service Providers (WSPs) and other stakeholders, to mitigate and adapt to climate change phenomenon.

The event was officially opened by Hon. Musalia Mudavadi, the Prime Cabinet Secretary and was accompanied by Cabinet Secretary- Water, Sanitation and Irrigation Hon. Alice Wahome and the host Governor H.E. Patrick Ole Ntutu.

Mudavadi lauded WASCO for providing the platform for the water sector workforce to learn and benchmark. He intimated that the Government is reforming the model of water and sanitation provision to better serve the citizens while cognizant of the climate change threats.

"Now more than ever the Government of Kenya is transforming the way it manages its water resources and delivers water and sanitation services to its citizens. Urgent action is needed to overcome climate change threats. 'He said.

The Cabinet Secretary- Water, Sanitation and Irrigation, Hon. Alice Wahome, said water is a key enable for development and called for collaborations between the National and County Government so that water and sanitation consumers are given appropriate and efficient services.

"Water is a key driver for development. The Government continues to implement policy, governance, and legal interventions to increase water storage and improve sanitation in the country" She added.

NCWSC Board Chair, Arnold Karanja, while addressing players and participants during the closing ceremony called for unity of purpose to enhance service delivery for Nairobians.

"You have exhibited exemplary level of discipline. I am proud of you. As you retreat to your various work stations, always think of how better you can serve our customers because that is very key for our sustainability.
